

#### LOCAL RULES

The number in brackets ( ) after the local rule of Golf which should be referred in case of need.

1. **Out or bounds (Def 21, Rule 29.1)**
  - (a) Outside the fence behind the 3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> alongside Lumley Beach Road, 10<sup>th</sup> tee alongside Lumley Beach Road, 14<sup>th</sup> Brown tennis court 16<sup>th</sup> Brown 18<sup>th</sup> Brown and club house.
  - (b) On the club house side of the rail fence at the 14<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> Browns
  - (c) Inside the tennis court or on the club house buildings or concrete surrounds.
  - (d) On the Bitumen surface of Lumley Beach Road where no fence exists.
2. **Ground under Repair (Def. 13 Rule 32):**
  - (a) Foot paths and tracks through the green.
  - (b) Stony ground through the green only on your own fairway.
  - (c) Slopes and base of crater on 9<sup>th</sup> Fairway. Relief is also available when playing the 10<sup>th</sup> hole, but without a preferred lie.
  - (d) Where marked by stakes or signs.
3. **Hole made by a Burrowing Animal (Rule 25.1)**

Relief may be taken for hole, cast or runway by ants, snakes or crabs, Browns (Def. 25 rule 32)
4. **Browns (Def. 25, rule 32)**
  - (a) A ball on the brown may be moved, not nearer the hole but either:
    - (i) 6 inches or
    - (ii) To the nearest point of relief when the grass verge interferes with the players putting backswin.
  - (b) A player may not test the depth or texture of the sand surface.
  - (c) Isolated small mounds of loose sand may brushed aside with the head of the putter but the cleaning of a continuous track to the hole is not permitted.
  - (d) Sand may be brushed around the hole when the cup is standing above the surface.
  - (e) No mark may be made on the surface of the sand to act as an aid in assessing the putting line.
  - (f) Rule 32-3 (C) applies to casual water on browns except that when the hole is completely surrounded by water the player whose ball lies on the ground may elect then to add two strokes to his score and deem the ball holed out, but the decision must be made prior to the first putt.
5. **Bunkers**
  - (a) Loose stones may be moveable obstructions (rule 31-1)
  - (b) A ball plugged on the face of the bunker may be dislodged using a finger and allowed to roll down into the shaded part of the bunker without penalty.
  - (c) A ball lying on the top of the slope of a bunker may, with the opponent or marker's permission be dropped behind the point where the ball lay, keeping that point between himself and the hole up to two club lengths behind the Bunker.
6. **Preferred Lies (rule 22)**
  - (a) When a player's ball lies between "fairway" boundanes along each side on the hole in play, he may prefer his lie within one club length not near the hole.
  - (b) On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> holes the Fairway starts on the side of the stream nearest the hole, on the 8<sup>th</sup> it starts on the far side of the beach adjacent to the 6<sup>th</sup> brown, on other holes the fairway starts at the ladies tee box.
  - (c) All "fairway" ditches shall be treated as G U R but where relief is taken the ball must be dropped outside "fairway" areas.
  - (d) Ball to remain on spot

If a ball when placed fails to remain on the spot on which it was placed it shall be replaced without penalty if it still fails to remain on that spot it shall be placed at the nearest spot not nearer the hole where it can be placed at rest.

However the ball so placed is deemed in play and the provisions of rule 18, 2 (b) which reads as follows:

Ball moving after address

If a ball moves after the player has addressed it other than a result of a stroke he shall be deemed to have moved the ball and shall incur a penalty stroke and the ball may be preferred again. Address the ball. A player has "addressed the ball" when he has taken his stance and has grounded his club except that in hazard a player has addressed the ball when he has taken his stance.
7. **Water hazards - (def. 14 rule 33)**
  - (a) All drains running across the line of the hole are water hazards.
  - (b) All drains running parallel with the line of play shall be treated as lateral water hazards except the action of drain adjacent to the 5<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> brown between the white stone which is G U R
  - (c) Small drains cut to remove water from browns and bunkers are G U R
8. **Trees**

A ball must be dropped without penalty, one club length clear of any tree less than two club lengths tall to prevent damage to the tree.
